### Monthly Labor Review

*Published by:* The Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor

*The Bureau's Mission:* Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) is the principal fact-finding agency for the Federal Government in the broad field of labor economics and statistics. The BLS is an independent national statistical agency that collects, processes, analyzes, and disseminates essential statistical data to the American public, the U.S. Congress, other Federal agencies, State and local governments, business, and labor. The BLS also serves as a statistical resource to the Department of Labor.

*Note:* The BLS tends to seek data using labor as a point of view. Their data is of interest to the general public, as well as the economic and government sectors. Look at the BLS data for salaries, benefits, employment (mass layoffs, unemployment, new jobs created, etc.), occupational safety and health, productivity, occupational outlook, employment by industry (state and federal).

Established in 1915, *Monthly Labor Review* is the principal journal of fact, analysis, and research from the [Bureau of Labor Statistics](#), an agency within the [U.S. Department of Labor](#). Each month, economists, statisticians, and experts from the Bureau join with private sector professionals and State and local government specialists to provide a wealth of research in a wide variety of fields—the labor force, the economy, employment, inflation, productivity, occupational injuries and illnesses, wages, prices, and many more.

The following departments appear in both the online and print editions of *Monthly Labor Review* with varying frequencies:

- *Labor month in review* summarizes the current issue each month and digests selected publications and news releases from the BLS. Read it for a quick overview of an issue's offerings and an update on what is new in labor statistics.
- *The law at work* explains legal decisions pertaining to the working world.
- *Book reviews* analyze the merits of today's hottest books for the *Review* audience.
- *Précis* briefly summarizes three or four articles, newsletter items, reports, working papers, etc., per month from the tremendous amount of information that passes across the MLR editors' desks.
- *Letters to the editor* give readers an opportunity to hear other readers' opinions.
- *At issue* is a synopsis of a "hot topic" that will keep you "in-the-know."

- *Regional trends* will present regional tabulations from the Current Population Survey.
- *International report* features accounts of economic and labor developments in other countries.
- *Technical notes* explain new statistical methodologies or programs conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. (BLS Website)
