### Survey of Current Business

*Published by:* Bureau of Economic Analysis, Department of Commerce.

*Bureau Mission and Role:* The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) promotes a better understanding of the U.S. economy by providing the most timely, relevant, and accurate economic accounts data in an objective and cost-effective manner. BEA produces economic accounts statistics that enable government and business decision-makers, researchers, and the American public to follow and understand the performance of the Nation's economy. To do this, BEA collects source data, conducts research and analysis, develops and implements estimation methodologies, and disseminates statistics to the public. (BEA Website)

*Note:* The BEA tends to analyze statistics using business, including government, productivity as a point of view. Their data may be of more interest to economists and the government. Look at BEA's data for questions pertaining to gross national product, balance of payments, output, income, personal income, trade.
