INVENTORY OF COPTIC.

With the exception of a few items which he did not see, the Coptic material listed in <sup>numbers 535-612</sup> ~~this inventory~~ was examined by Mr. W. E. Crum, at the request of Mr. Bell of the British Museum and Mr. Kelsey, and the inventory is based upon his notes. He requested authorization to excerpt words for his Coptic dictionary, now in preparation, and did so.

The items listed are papyrus, unless otherwise described.

For convenience of reference the inventory numbers begin where the INVENTORY OF PAPHRI prepared in 1920 leaves off. The first number is therefore 535, the last number in the former inventory being 534.

Nos. 593 - 603 formed a part of a single find of much importance. They were brought from Egypt to the British Museum by Sir E. Wallis Budge, in February, 1921, and, in the division of papyri by the British Museum, were allotted to the University of Michigan.

The leaves of No. 593 and the rolls (Nos. 594 - 603) were extremely brittle. They were separated and unrolled with great skill by Mr. C.T. Lamacraft, of the British Museum.
