

Storage and Care of Audiovisual Recordings – Tips, Suppliers & Vendors

The following are tips for storing your audiovisual recordings. Below the tips is a list of companies in the U.S. that specialize in preservation supplies for housing, storing, and displaying library and archival materials. Storage Tips

Reels:

- Store magnetic tape on slotless hubs
- Store magnetic tape tails out (played all the way to the end--only rewind right before playback)
- Store film heads out (ready to be played)
- Store magnetic tape reels in plastic (polypropylene or polyethylene) cases

Discs:

- Store in polyethylene sleeves, or paper sleeves with polyethylene lining
- Store upright, in storage boxes if possible, or using dividers. It's important that you don't allow the discs to lean, or they can bend and warp

Cassettes:

- Store in cases
- Store upright, not lying flat

CDs and DVDs:

- Store in cases
- Store upright (While CD/DVDs can be bought in large quantities on a spindle, it's best to buy cases - which are inexpensive - for the CD/DVDs that you want to preserve)

In most cases you should not attempt to clean the items yourself, as cleaning solutions can often do harm to the recordings. Cleaning should be left to trained professionals.

Store all materials away from the sun and other heat sources. The cooler the better, but before you stick it in your basement, keep in mind the potential for water damage if your basement is vulnerable or prone to high humidity or flooding. Generally speaking, whether in the basement or in other areas of your residence, don't store recordings on the bottom shelf. This will help protect them from possible water damage.
